
MTSS in Action


Preschool

Thomas Metcalf has 3 sections of preschool

- Morning Session: 8am-11am
- Afternoon Session: 12pm-3pm
- Full Day Session: 8am-3pm *new this year


Students applying for preschool must be 4 years of age by 9/1/2024.

The preschool program is separate from the K-8th grade program. All families will have to reapply for Kindergarten with the rest of the community.



Regional program for students with low incidence disabilities; hearing and vision

- Offers a continuum of programming both in the home school districts and at ISU Laboratory Schools
- Students receiving services at Metcalf and U-High are placed by the home district IEP team decision.



What is the Process for admission?

1. Apply

- Applications can be found on the website or in the main office.
- 2. Submit Documentation
 - Appraisal Form: Families should supply their child's current teacher or child care provider with the Appraisal Form Instruction Sheet
 - **Report Card:** Families should submit their child's most recent report card or progress summary to the Metcalf main office or via email at mvheld@ilstu.edu
 - IAR or equivalent exam (for 4th-7th grade applicants only): Families should submit their child's most recent exam results to the Metcalf main office or via email at mvheld@ilstu.edu
- 3. Wait for Results. Letters will be mailed out on or before April 15th.
- 4. Dial 4 Screenings: Any child selected for admission to Kindergarten or Preschool will have to complete a Dial 4 screening before final admission is granted.



What is the process for selection?

- 1. The Metcalf Admissions Committee meets and sorts applications by grade level, current school district, etc.
- 2. Student applications are pulled by a blind draw process filling open seats.
- 3. Siblings and lab school employee children receive priority consideration.
